Chrome Improves Breeze by Breaking the Backspace Button

Google recently announced that its new version of Chrome, set to release at the end of July, will no longer allow users to hit the backspace key as a shortcut to the previous page. To navigate back, users must instead revert to the traditional method of clicking on the "Back" button at the top of the page, or use the Alt + Left combination.

So, how does this affect Tropics Breeze? In a great way! What it means for Breeze users is a decrease in accidental data loss, typically caused by hitting the backspace key when the cursor was outside of a text box. Before, a mistaken backspace would cause the previous screen to load, losing any data from the current screen in the process. Now, a slip of the hand on the keyboard is no longer a cause for concern and we can all breathe a collective sigh of relief.
